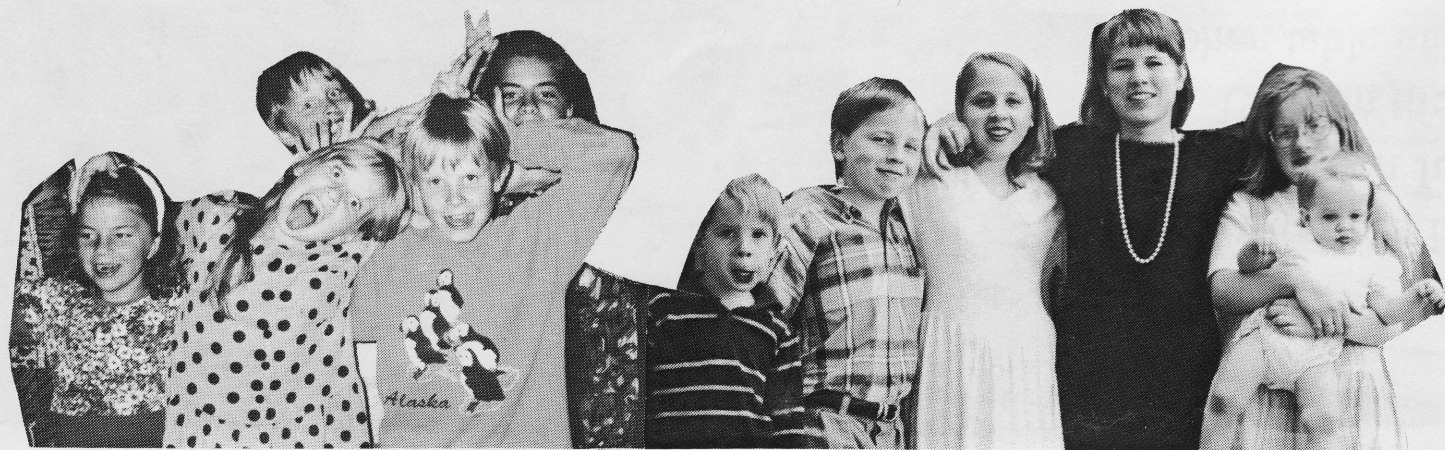
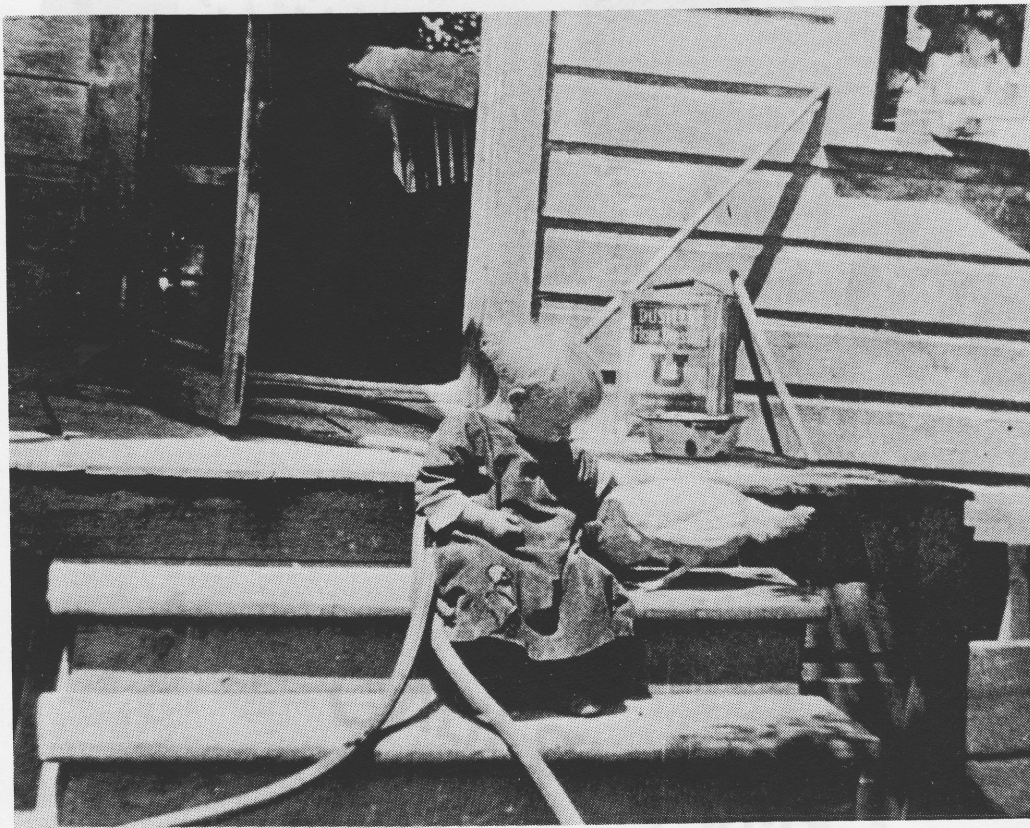


# 50+ Years with Cyril and Mary

Kearl

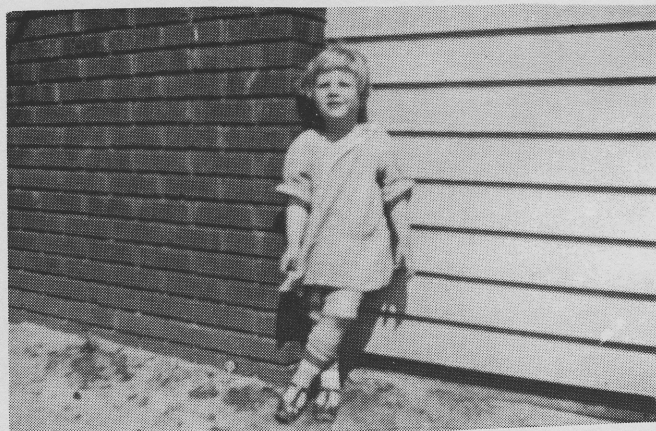
Cyril and his pet chicken

County.

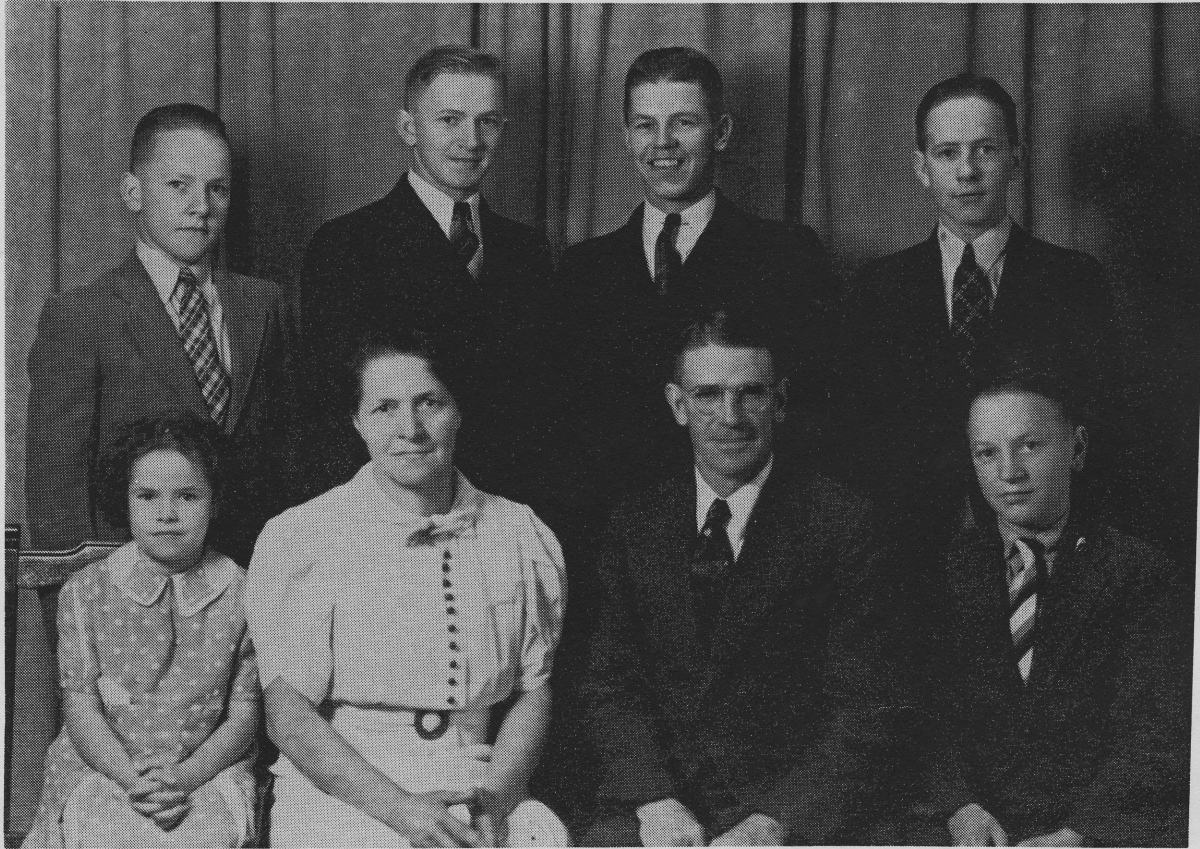
The Chase Kearl family. Cyril is the little guy on the front row.

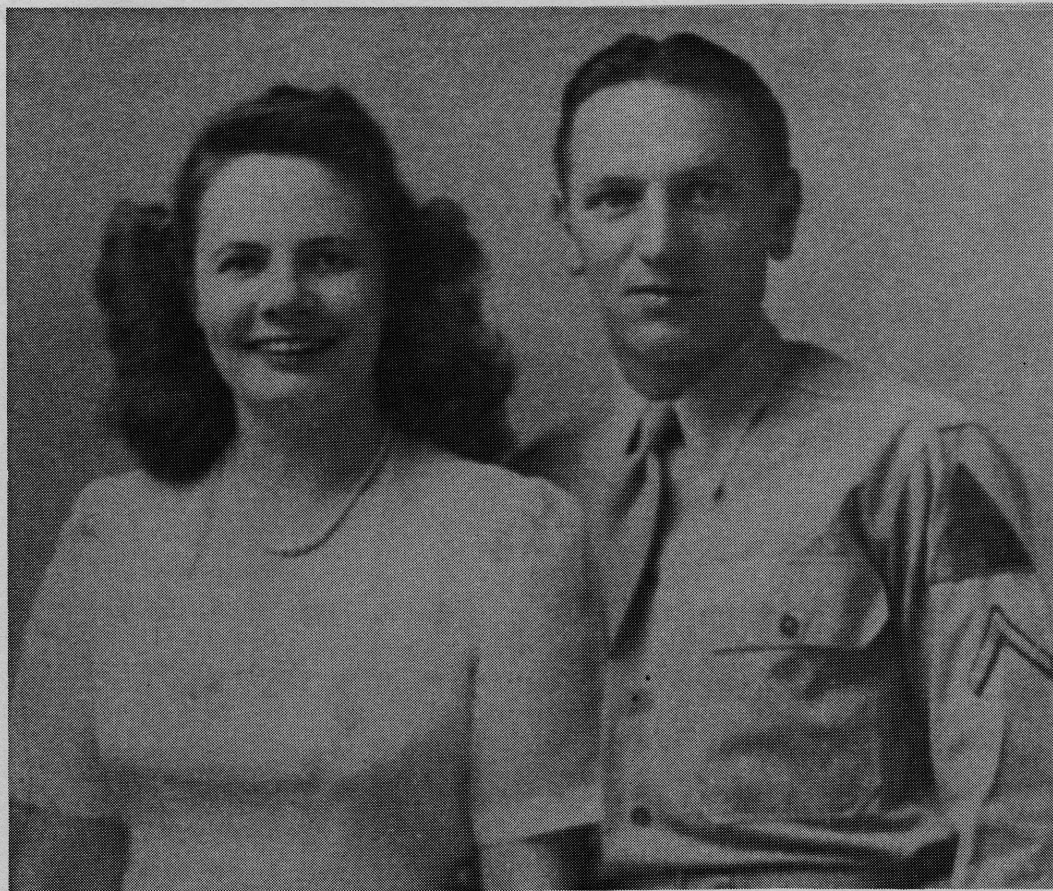
After graduating from High School both Mary and Cyril went to Utah State University where they met. Cyril was smitten.

Plant

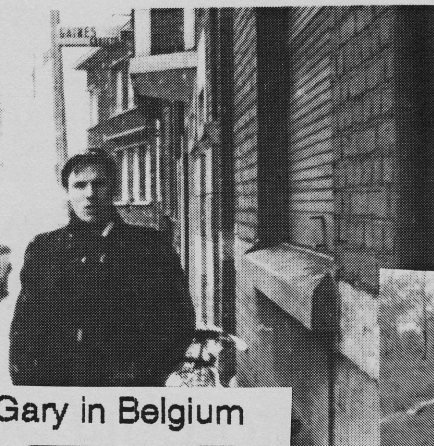
# Kearl Appointed Manager-Product Engineering, HR

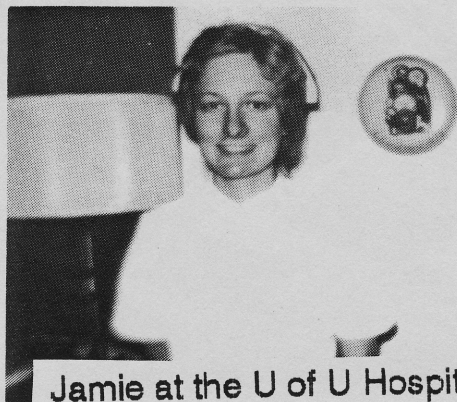

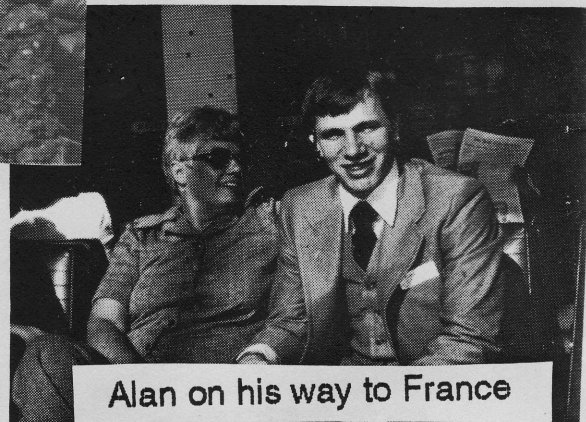

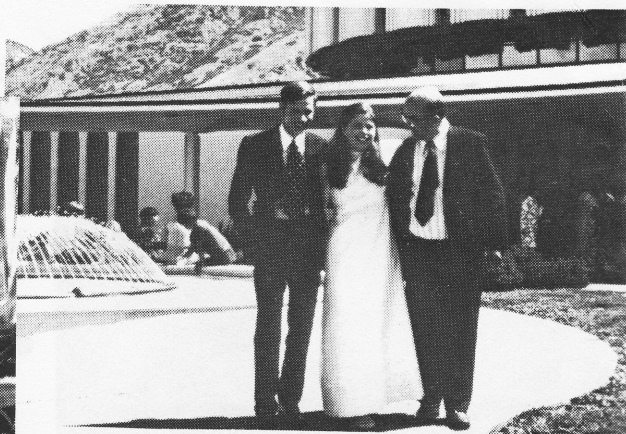
Our children grew up, went on missions for our church and served in the Armed Forces. Edward was wounded twice in Viet Naam.

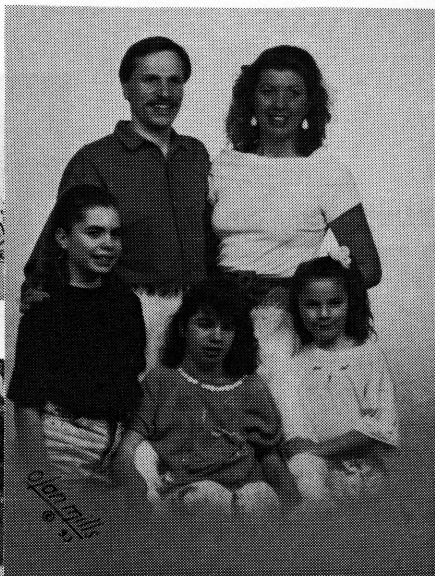

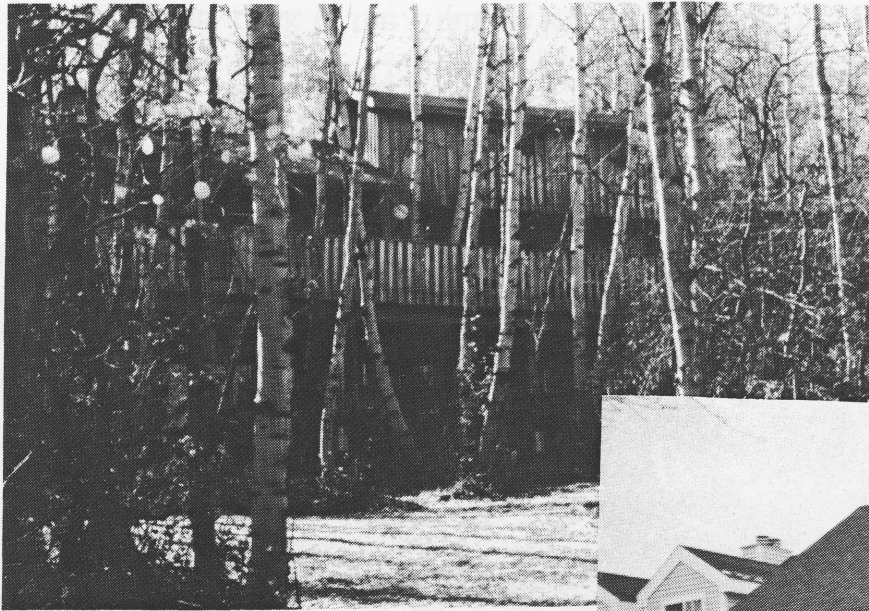

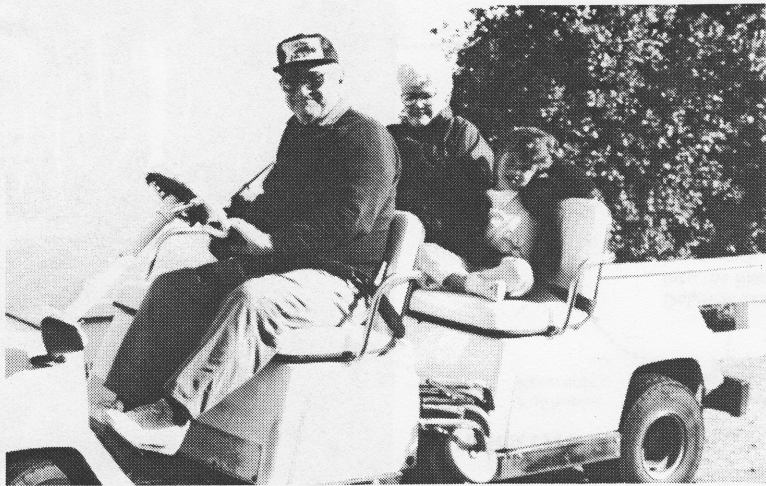


We built a home in

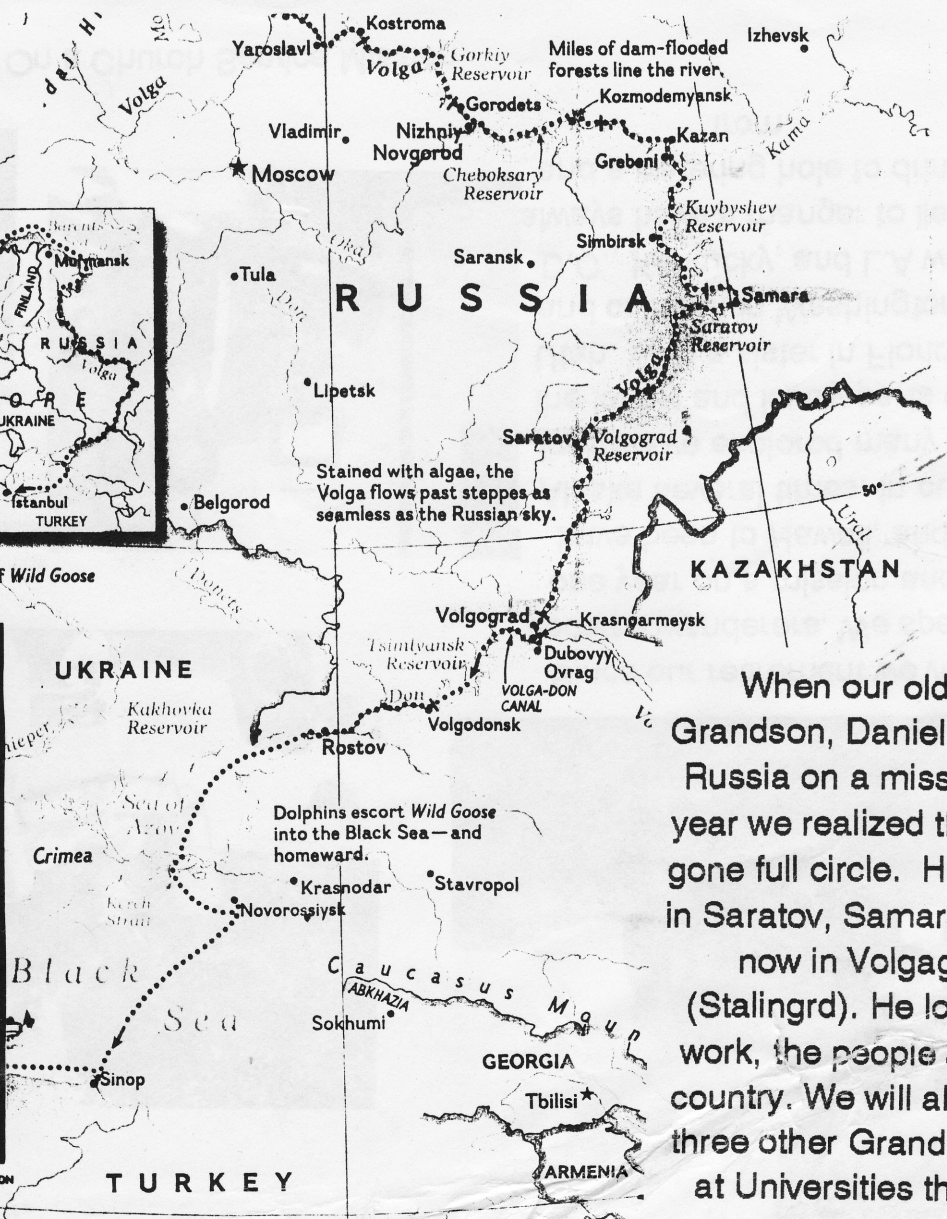
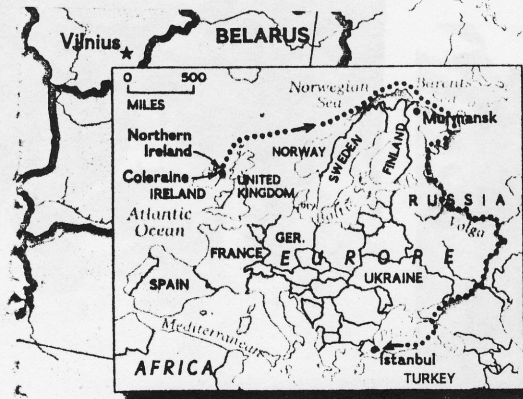
